

Online Resource Troubleshooting

AAA Math	Select tabs at the top of the page: Games, Lessons, Quizzes, Manipulatives, Brain Teasers, and More - No account required.
Academy Act	Sign in as a student. Then, sign up with an email unless you know the code from your teacher. No class is needed to access site. Follow sign-in prompts to continue without class code. Choose any subject or follow day-by-day schedule at the bottom of the page.
Achieve 3000	Grades 2-12: Select grade and challenge level; create log-in.
AmHistory	For United States History activities by subject, time period, or activity type, select desired activity. No log-in required.
AP Central	This site provides information and updates from the College Board regarding Advanced Placement Courses, Online Practices and information about AP Testing.
Ben's Guide	Select desired age and browse multiple resources. No log-in required.
Buzz Aldrin Interview	You can watch the video, view the video transcript, read a short biography of Buzz Aldrin, or see a list of his children's books.
Carolina Learning	This site helps students find out more about the <u>Science</u> topics they are investigating while developing their math skills and literacy abilities related to informational text. No account required. Click on links to open activities or lesson plans.
Chomp Chomp	Scroll down on homepage to browse multiple resources for grammar practice. No log-in required.
CLEP	The courses are designed to prepare students for the major "Advanced Placement" (AP)* or "College Level Examination Program" (CLEP)* tests offered by the College Board, including subjects such as History, Computer Science, Math, English and Economics.
Common Sense Media	Scroll down to the scheduled time of activities. Here are a few highlights for the resource: Read A Loud: Brightly Storytime, Art/ Drawing with Illustrators, Drawing Live with Mo, Draw Every Day with JJK, How To Toon, and Finish the Comic Pages to only name a few.
CoolMath4Kids	Select content area and then topic. No account required.
Discovery Education	Choose subject area from the drop down menu. No log in required.

<u>Ed Helper</u>	Site provides free printable learning math workbooks for grades K-8. No account needed. Scroll down the right side of the page to click on the specific grade level workbook to print. If printing is unavailable, then use a piece of loose-leaf paper to record answers.
<u>Highlights Kids</u>	Select one of the engaging options at top of page from activities to games to podcast (under listen).
<u>Hour of Code</u>	This includes coding activities for students in PK-12 grade. Search by grade level, experience level, subject, and type of technology viewing on. No log-in required.
<u>iCivics</u>	For free government and civics education lessons, select "Sign In" at top right of homepage and create free account.
<u>IXL</u>	Click on the student's grade level. There's a 10 question limit per subject and per day.
<u>Khan Academy</u>	Grades 7-8: Click on the pull down menu (next to Search). Select content area by student's grade level. Begin with skills from top and work downwards. Grades 9-12: Select Arts & Humanities and then Grammar.
<u>Khan Academy Kids</u>	Parents should create an account through the help tab. An email will be sent for further registration information.
<u>Kids National Geographic</u>	No account required. Browse through multiple resources on homepage.
<u>LA Public Broadcasting</u>	Browse for multiple resources on the right-hand side of the page. Check out the broadcasting schedule as well.
<u>Library of Congress</u>	For primary source sets, lesson plans, presentations, and activities, select desired resource. No log-in required.
<u>Lois Lowry Interview</u>	You can watch the video, view the video transcript, read a short biography of Lois Lowry, or see a list of his children's books.
<u>MobyMax</u>	Use this site if student does not remember username and password into Moodle. Choose homeschool on the right side of the page.
<u>Modern States</u>	Sign up by creating an account.
<u>Moodle STPPS</u>	Log in to Moodle. Click on District Textbooks & Applications. Select grade level and click on MobyMax icon.
<u>Mystery Science</u>	Click on the student's grade level and begin with the mini-lesson.
