

Unit 4 Module A Facing Challenges and Change 2nd grade / ELA

Unit 4 Module A Description:

Students will recount and describe characters' challenges in stories. Students will create narrative texts that include challenges and characters' responses to those challenges. Learners will explain how facing challenges leads people and communities to change.
